Getting to Know Your Elected Officials

This month begins our introduction to the Wells County Commissioners: Blake Gerber, President; Kevin Woodward, Vice President; and newly elected Mike Vanover.

"The board of County Commissioners as a body has a wide range of executive and administrative authority.

Among the most important powers are those related to:

- Auditing and authorizing claims against the county. {IC 36-2-6-2}
- Receiving bids and authorizing contracts.
- Controlling, maintaining, and supervising county property including courthouses, jails, and public offices. {IC 36-2-2-24}
- Supervising construction and maintenance of roads and bridges.
- Exercising appointive powers including both the selection of members to fill positions on boards, commissions, committees, appointments of certain department heads.
- Planning and implementing strategies for solid waste handling as members of solid waste district boards. {IC 13-21-3-1}
- Exercising the county's power of eminent domain.
- Serving with the county surveyor, as members of the county drainage board.
- Adopting ordinances and regulations to control the location, construction or repair of all wells within the county."



Kevin Woodward Wells County Commissioner District 3

Tell us a little bit about yourself. Born and raised in my early years in Ossian. Graduated High School and

attended college in northern Michigan. Married for 38 years to Linda, have two grown married sons, and twin 15 month old granddaughters. Elected to the Ossian Town Board in 1990, Wells County Council in 1994, and currently a Wells County Commissioner since 2000, continually servicing Wells County for 31 years. I am semi-retired and enjoying family while spending off time in northern Michigan.

Why did you choose to run for office? I was asked to run for Ossian Town Council because the supporters felt I could bring stability to the town and away I went 32 years ago.
