

John Whicker Mayor City of Bluffton

Tell us a little bit about yourself.

I was born and raised on a dairy farm in Central Indiana and was one of seven children. I graduated from Purdue University and served a tour of duty in Germany with the U. S.

Army. Jolin and I were married in 1964. We have three adult children and five grandchildren. We moved to Bluffton in 1976 because of a job transfer. I worked for the Moorman Mfg. Company (later purchased by ADM) for 25 years. I served as plant manager; also being responsible for the distribution of our products to warehouses located in Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, and Kentucky. Upon retirement with Moorman's, I served as President of Bi-County Services, Inc. for 16 years, retiring in 2010. I have been involved in various non-profit organizations in Bluffton and have attended the First Presbyterian Church for 40 years. We live in a great community.

Why did you choose to run for office? After serving four years on Common Council, I felt a need to run for Mayor, due to Mayor Ted Ellis' decision to retire.
